RESIGNATIONS, APPOINTMENTS AND LEAVES

- 1. Resignation of Mr. Carlton S. Garrison, half-time graduate assistant in Farm Crops, effective March 31, 1937.
- 2. Resignation of Mrs. Joseph Murray (Caroline Rumpsa), stenographer in the Department of Journalism and Publications, effective March 31, 1937.
- 3. Appointment of Miss Alice F. Hutchinson as Extension Specialist in Child Care and Training, effective May 1st at a salary of \$2500.00 per year. Miss Hutchinson replaces Mrs. Lydia Ann Lynde, whose resignation became effective February 28th.
- 4. Full time appointment of Dr. E. S. Weisner as Extension Specialist in Poultry Husbandry (now on a two third's time basis at \$2000.00 per year), effective as of April 1st at the rate of \$3000.00 per year.
