June 1, 1932

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 P.M.

The following matters pertaining to the budget set up for the year 1932-33 were discussed and acted upon as stated:

1. The tentative budget as prepared in accordance with the general program adopted at the May meeting of the State Board and showing a reduction in expenditures over those of the past year in the amount of \$270,275.00 was approved. In brief the reduction will be made up as follows:

Elimination of 13 graduate assistantships.

The elimination of graduate assistantships referred to under item #2 covers the following:

1. The one-half time assistantship in the Soils Department held during the past year by Mr. R. E. Pasco.
2. The one-half time graduate assistantship in Department of Dairy Husbandry, held by Mr. Charles P. Halloran during the past year.
3. The one-half time graduate assistantship in the Department of Botany, held by Mr. E. Y. Monsma during the past year.
4. The one-half time assistantship in the Department of Civil Engineering, held by Mr. Postmaster during the past year.
5. The one-half time assistantship in the Department of Electrical Engineering held by Mr. Woodard during the past year.
6. The one-half time assistantship in the Department of Engineering Experiment Station held by Mr. Alfred Clark during the past year.
7. One one-half time assistantship in the Department of Sociology on Purnell.
8. Kellogg Fellowship held by Mr. Weddell in the Department of Forestry during the past two years has not been renewed.
9. One one-half time assistantship in the Department of Horticulture, now held by Mr. G.F. Gray.
10. One one-quarter time assistantship in Farm Crops held by Mr. Dunton during the past year.
11. One one-quarter time assistantship in Bacteriology held by Mr. Etchells during the past year.
12. One quarter time off the half time assistantship held by Mr. James Scales during the past year. Mr. Scales will remain on quarter time basis instead of half.
13. One half-time assistantship in Chemistry held by Mr. Robert Pennell during the past year.

Cuts in salaries to become effective July 1, 1932.

3. It was decided that cuts in salaries and budgets should become effective July 1, 1932, without exception, and that cuts should be based on the present budget.

Following exempt from cuts

4. The following persons were judged exempt from salary cuts, in accordance with recent contracts and agreements.

Mr. Jackson E. Torne, newly appointed Librarian
Mr. James Crowley, Football Coach - contract recently renewed
Mr. Wm. T. Oglesby, Instructor in Physiology and Pharmacology appointed for the year beginning next Sept. 1, 1932, at a salary of \$2100 replacing Dr. J. W. Patton whose salary was \$2650 per year.

Dr. Pirnie to take cut.

5. It was agreed that Dr. Pirnie, of the Kellogg Bird Sanctuary should be regarded as a College employee and should be subject to the same salary adjustment as other staff members.

Norma Schmitt to take cut.

6. It was agreed that Miss Norma Schmitt of the Library Staff whose salary was recently increased from \$1200 to \$1400 per year be subject to the same salary adjustment as other staff members, a readjustment of her salary to be allowed at a later date.

Mrs. Landon placed on part time basis at \$1400.

7. It was agreed that Mrs. Landon, former Librarian of the College be placed on a part time basis in the library, at a salary of \$1400 per year, effective July 1st.

Prof. Ryder full time basis Head Dept.

8. It was agreed that Professor Ryder be placed on a full time basis as Head of the Department of History and Political Science after July 1st, at an average departmental head salary, as such salary appears to be with a 7% cut.

Young to be placed on average departmental hd. sal.

9. It was agreed that Director Young of the Athletic Department should be placed on a salary equal to that of the average departmental head, effective July 1st.

Mrs. McGee offered cont. of leave.

10. It was agreed that Mrs. Rose McGee of the English Department now on leave, be offered a continuation of her leave, to be followed by the retention of Dr. J.M. Smith as Instructor in English for the academic year 1932-35.

Mr. Stack's half-time pay to be cut.

11. It was agreed that Professor Stack's leave of absence should be on the basis approved at the November meeting of the Board, namely one-half pay, but that the half pay should be subject to the 7% cut as other members of the division.

R.L. Cook to be given leave on 1/3 pay.

12. It was agreed that Mr. R. L. Cook, Instructor in Soils be given a leave of absence to obtain his Ph.D. at Wisconsin, with one-third time pay from October 1, 1932 to July 1, 1935.

Serg. Foley advised to resign.

13. It was agreed that Sergeant Foley, who has been in charge of the stores of the Military Department be advised to resign.

Bronz tablet placed in Ag. Bldg. in mem. of Manley Miles

14. It was agreed to approve the placing of a bronz tablet in the agricultural building commemorating the services of Dr. Manly Miles, first professor of Practical Agriculture in any institution in the world. This measure was taken at the suggestion of Dr. F. S. Kedzie.

15. It was agreed that the College will stand the expense of the Water Carnival preparation this year over and above the amount of \$500 which amount will be carried by the Senior class. This action was taken inasmuch as the Carnival this year is in reality a part of the Seventy-Fifth Anniversary celebration of the College.

16. It was agreed that such part of the budget of the Alumni Association as is appropriated by the College should be subject to the 12% budget cut applied to all other departments of the College.

17. It was agreed that such deficits as shall appear in the departmental budgets between now and the next Board meeting be taken care of from the reserve fund.

18. On motion of Mr. Brody, seconded by Mr. McPherson, it was voted to approve the granting of honorary degrees at the Commencement on June 13th as follows:

L.L.D.

Mr. J. W. Beaumont of the class of 1882, member of the State Board of Agriculture at one time and long engaged in the practice of Law in Detroit.

Mr. Charles McKenny, a graduate of M.S.C. in 1881 and for very many years president of Michigan State Normal College at Ypsilanti.

Mr. D. B. Waldo at one time a student at this Institution and for many years president of the Western State Teachers College.

Doctor of Agriculture

Hon. John Clark Ketcham, Congressman from Michigan, associated in Congress with acts contributing to the better welfare of Agriculture such as the Capper-Ketcham Act.

L. Whitney Watkins, M.S.C. 1895. Since his graduation, connected with projects that were related to agriculture and for many years member of the State Board of Agriculture.

Doctor of Science

W.K. Kellogg, manufacturer and philanthropist who has shown his interest in Agriculture and Science by the donation of the Kellogg Farm and the Kellogg Bird Sanctuary. (Mr. Kellogg declined by wire to accept this degree).

Richard A. Smith, State Geologist since 1919, associated with the Michigan Geological Survey since 1911. Author of many scientific contributions to Michigan geology.

Lawrence T. Clark, M.S.C. 1904. For many years the managing director of research and biological laboratories of Parke Davis & Company, Detroit.

Lyman T. Briggs, M.S.C. 1895. For many years connected with the National Bureau of Standards.

Doctor of Forestry

Christopher M. Granger, M.S.C. 1907. Connected with the U.S. Forestry Service since 1907. Since 1929 in charge of the forest inventory of the Nation.

Master of Home Economics

Florence L. Hall, M.S.C. 1909, in charge of certain phases of Home Economics research in the U.S. Department of Agriculture at Washington.

Mechanical Engineer

Horace T. Thomas, M.S.C. 1901. For many years the chief engineer of the Reo Motor Car Company of Lansing.
