Regarding duties of Market Director.

In consideration of the fact that many questions are being asked relative to the power and duties of the Field Agent in Marketing, the State Board of Agriculture deems it advisable to issue the following.

The Field Agent in Marketing shall investigate production and marketing of farm products. He shall assist in the organization of co-operative and other associations and afford them such advice and assistance as he may; shall assist in establishing grades and standards for marketing purposes. He shall give information to Michigan producers on the market conditions in the various states of the Union and foreign states. He shall gather such facts as may be available regarding the relative crop production and the relative demand, both at home and abroad, and shall gather and present to the agricultural producers and the public all such facts and information as may be attainable regarding such production and market condition.

We do not deem it advisable however, that he enterinto the question or practice of fixing or attempting to fix or establish prices on any agricultural products. We deem it the business of the Field Agent in Marketing to supply to the agricultural producers the above information speedily and in plain and concise form so that each individual or co-operative society may judge for themselves when to sell and what prices to demand.
