RESOLVED, THAT THE FOLLOWING RULES SHOULD BE OBSERVED IN THE REFUND OF STUDENT FEES AND ROOM RENT:

Students voluntarily leaving college within twenty days from the date of their classification will, upon approval of the President, be refunded all fees paid, as shown by classification card, including-matriculation-fee, room rent for the even weeks remaining, with the exception of the matriculation fee, which will in no case be refunded; after that time and previous to the close of the first half of the term, only one half such fees will be refunded with room rent as above indicated. After the close of the first half of the term, no refund will be made except of room rent for the even weeks remaining. No refund of any kind will be made to students who are suspended or expelled from college or put out of their rooms for breach of disciplin.

On motion of Mr. Graham, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That of the amount of the 1/10 mill appropriation remaining in the hands of the State Treasurer at the close of the fiscal year 1910, not more than \$2000.00 will be required to cover the current expenses of Michigan Agricultural College on account of "former year."

On motion of Mr. Oberdorffer, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That there is hereby appropriated under the provisions of Act 232 P.A. 1901, as amended, for Sundry Improvements at Michigan Agricultural College, the sum of \$5000.00.
