Prophet, Department of Geography, salary \$2500 per year, effective September 1st. 2. Mr. Donald O'Hara, part-time instructor in Summer Session at a salary of #225 for the six weeks session, providing his services are needed. 3. Miss Caroline Cooley, from half-time clerk in the Economics Section, to full time during the months of July, August and September, at \$100 per month, the extra half-time pay to be paid from the regular Purnell Station allotment to the Economics Section. 4.
