On motion of Mr. Waterbury, Prof. French was authorized to attend a meeting on the Commission of Rural and Agricultural Education at Buffalo May 25th and 26th, with transportation expenses paid.

On motion of Mr. Doherty, that portion of the College farm lying west of Harrison Avenue containing about 97 acres, was leased to the War Board for the period of the present war and the President and Secretary were authorized to execute a lease for the same.

The Secretary presented a communication from the Consumers Power Company, by Mr. A. L. Watkins, requesting the purchase of an additional tract of land in Alcona County.

Reappraisal to be asked and land sold.

On motion of Mr. Doherty, the Secretary was authorized to ask the Public Domain Commission to make a reappraisal of the lands in question having in mind the possibility of gravel beds contained within them, and to arrange for their sale on the basis of such appraisal, it being understood that only the land described in the request of the company shall be conveyed and that the price shall be the price of the entire forties crossed by the lands described plus the cost of appraisal, the terms being identical with the conveyance of land to the same com-

pany in former cases.

On motion of Mr. Woodman, Mr. Benjamin P. Pattison was appointed County Agent for Delta County beginning May 15th at a salary of \$2000.00 per year none of which is to be paid by the College until after July 1st.

On motion of Mr. Waterbury, the resignation of Mr. I. K. Maystead, presented by Director Baldwin, was accepted to take effect May 15th.

On motion of Mr. Graham, \$48,086.33 was guaranteed to the federal government as an off-set to the federal Smith-Lever funds for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1918, the sources of these funds to be established by the Director.

On motion of Mr. Beaumont, the purchase of 50 lbs. of peanuts, 20 lbs. of mints and 10 gal. of punch, for entertainment of short course students and county agents, was authorized.
