Michigan State College

As one of the leading Land Grant colleges and the oldest agricultural college in the world, Michigan State College provides a technical, practical, and cultural education for its student body, in addition to extensive research and extension services to the people of Michigan.

Now in its 95th year, Michigan State College has grown from two buildings and six faculty members to one of the largest universities in the nation. It has approximately 1,300 staff members engaged in teaching and research, 124 modern permanent and 988 temporary buildings, and almost 12,000 acres of land, including 540 acres in the campus area proper.

Founded in 1855 to educate youth for the major occupation of that day--farming--Michigan State College has broadened its offerings as young people, preparing for other vocations, have sought the advantages of college training. Today, approximately 100 different courses of study are offered in the schools of Agriculture, Business and Public Service, Engineering, Home Economics, Science and Arts and Veterinary Medicine. This excludes the curriculum of the Basic College which has been hailed as one of the most progressive ideas for higher education in the nation today; and the Graduate School, which offers 56 courses leading to the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of music, master of forestry, doctor of philosophy, and doctor of education.

Michigan State College continually strives to expand its service to the people of the state. Five sub-stations of the Agricultural Experiment Station are maintained in various parts of the state, and more than 225 conferences, short courses and special courses are held each year on the Spartan campus. During the 1950-51 year, more than 85,000 persons attended these "extra-curricular" educational courses and meetings.

Today, some 15,000 students from Michigan and other states and from nations all over the world are attending the college at East Lansing--8,200 of whom are housed on the campus proper. With about 85 percent of these students coming from communities in every section of the state, Michigan State College is doing its part to fill the greatly increased demand of the younger generation for higher education.

In the agricultural, business and professional fields, Michigan State College has proved its worth to the people of the state of Michigan, paying dividends many times the appropriation for its maintenance made each year by the state and national governments. Noted for its democratic and friendly spirit, the student body harmonizes with the college faculty to make Michigan State College a first class educational institution.

COLLEGE MUSEUM

The College Museum, in the Auditorium Building, will be open to visitors this afternoon from 1:00 to 6:00. Attention of the public is called especially to the exhibits of Michigan fishes, deer, and beaver in their natural surroundings; Bolivian mummy; an alcove of colorful insects; a panorama of the glacial evolution of Michigan; the Family Tree of Man; and "Weapons of War" from the cross-bow of 1500 A. D. to the bazooka and grease gun of World War II.

Articles of early Michigan are being collected for the planned Agricultural Museum--anything that was used in the farm home or on the farm will be accepted. Contact the Museum in person or by letter.

ART EXHIBITIONS

An exhibition of work by students in the Department of Art is on display in the Art Room, on third floor of the Student Union from 8 A. M. to 9 P. M. The examples constitute a selection of the best work done during the past year in ceramics, sculpture, drawing, painting, design, industrial design and print making. Visitors are cordially welcomed. There is no charge.

WKAR AND WKAR-FM, COLLEGE RADIO STATIONS

WKAR and WKAR-FM, the College Radio Stations, with studios above the main entrance to the auditorium, are open all day to visitors.

BEAL GARFIELD BOTANIC GARDEN

In the Beal Garfield Botanic Garden are between two and three thousand botanical plants. The Garden is open to visitors any time.

THE FREDERICK COWLES JENISON GYMNASIUM AND FIELDHOUSE

The Frederick Cowles Jenison Gymnasium and Fieldhouse is one of the largest and best equipped buildings for physical education and athletics in the nation. It houses the Department of Physical Education for men and provides facilities for intramural and collegiate sports. The building will be open all day to visitors.

HORTICULTURAL GARDENS

The Horticultural Gardens, east of the Horticulture Building and the greenhouses, will be open all day to visitors.

THE COLLEGE FARMS

The College Farms are located on the south side of the Red Cedar River. By driving south on Farm Lane, the road running north and south past the College Auditorium, many of the farm buildings can be seen. Attention of the visitors is called especially to the College Dairy Barn, the Beef Cattle Barn, the Pavilion, the new Agricultural Engineering Building, the new Research Greenhouses, and the College Poultry unit.

MICHIGAN STATE COLLEGE BUILDING PROGRAM

An extensive post-war building program which is now nearing completion may be viewed by a drive around the modern and beautiful campus. Approximately 40 per cent of the cost for the physical expansion was secured through legislative appropriation and the remainder through self-liquidating loans without public expense. Buildings completed which have been financed on a self-liquidating basis are: Landon, Yakeley and Gilchrist Halls for women; Snyder-Phillips and Shaw Halls for men; food storage building; 11 apartment buildings for married students and faculty; and additions to Macklin Field stadium and the Student Union Building. Buildings completed which have been financed by state appropriation are: Berkey Hall, Natural Science, Physics and Mathematics, Home Management, Agricultural Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Plant Science Greenhouses on Farm Lane, and a steam generating plant. Under construction on state funds is Giltner Hall for veterinary medicine on East Circle Drive. Alumni Memorial Chapel and the Kellogg Center for Continuing Education are under construction on gift funds.
