THE COLLEGE IS QUARANTINED.

WE ARE ALL SHUT IN.

As there are now three new casses of diphtheria, and the College has been quarantined, the students presented to President Clute a petition requesting the faculty to suspend all classes and exercises for the present accordingly the faculty voted to do so until the quarantine is removed.

Most of the Profs. gave out lessons to the students in chapel to be learned during the recess. All the present cases of diphtheria have been removed to the hospital and are doing well. The rooms 8, 18, 26, and 35 William's Hall from which these cases were removed will be carefully fumigated.

came down with diphtheria will be removed to the third story of the Veterinary Laboratory and kept in quarantine.

Most of the students on the second and third floors of William's Hall have moved out so that these floors can be fumigated.

Students from any hall will not be allowed either in their work or games to mingle with students from other halls. This precaution is taken that contagion may not be carried from one hall to another.
