TO CLERK OF CAMP, MODERN WOODMEN OF AMERICA:

PASS REPORT NO. 7 (FOR JULY) enclosed. This report, properly formulated on the basis of the NEW RATES that became effective July 1, 1919, must be forwarded to the Head Clerk, with correct remittance to cover, immediately after the close of business July 31.

THE REMITTANCE must include Assessment No. 7, paid by all Beneficial members for July at their new rates, and monthly Per Capita of 15 cents each. (Include Per Capita also for Social members.) Arrearages for those reinstating from suspension dating prior to July 1 must be computed and remitted for at the old rates—including PATRIOTIC FUND rate of 10 cents for each \$500 insurance—and the current (No. 7 or July) assessment at the new rates WITHOUT THE PATRIOTIC FUND.

THE PATRIOTIC FUND rate was DISCONTINUED July 1, 1919. All Beneficial members (including those adopted and whose Benefit certificates were delivered from and after July 1) are NOT liable for Patriotic fund rate.

ALL BENEFICIAL MEMBERS who completed membership prior to July 1, 1919, have been rerated at the new rates, APPLIED AT THEIR ENTRY, OR ORIGINAL, AGES WHEN THEY JOINED THE SOCIETY. The Clerk of each Camp has been furnished a list of such rerated members by the Head Clerk. This list included names, entry ages, old rates, and new rates—the latter effective July 1. All additional or new members received by adoption or transfer between the date such list was compiled and June 30, 1919, inclusive, must be remitted for at the NEW RATES. CLERKS SHOULD USE THE OFFICIAL LIST (and the foregoing additions, if any) as a guide and basis in formulating Pass Report No. 7.

MEMBERSHIP AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT (page 9 of Pass Report No. 7) is called to your special attention. On account of establishing an entirely new base to conform to the new rates, the net benefit or data called for in Item 1 can not be conveniently used. It is suggested that under this item the net number of members remitted for last report (No. 6) be entered, omitting in Item 1 "Amount of Rates". Any and all changes shown in the body of No. 7 Pass Report should be entered under the proper items in the Membership and Financial Statement.

THE RATE SUMMARY (page 10) must be completely and correctly filled out to insure prompt and proper audit of the Pass Report, as well as to avoid complications and corrections. The formulation of the RATE SUMMARY must be made from an actual Pages 9 and 10 of Pass Report Are Quite Important

At the same time, the register should be verified and reconciled with the official list of rerated members as heretofore furnished by the Head Clerk. The footing of the RATE SUMMARY, if correctly formulated, will furnish the membership and net amount of Benefit rates due on Assessment No. 7 and should be entered at Item 15 of the MEMBERSHIP AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT (page 9).

IN LISTING REINSTATEMENTS on page 3 of the No. 7 Pass Report, the new rates of the members should be entered in the "Rate" column. In computing the Benefit arrearage due on such reinstated members, their old rates, to which must be added their Patriotic fund rates, are to be used and the aggregate amount of such arrearage should be entered at Item 16 of the Membership and Financial Statement on page 9 of the Pass Report. In order that the auditor who will handle your No. 7 Pass Report at the Head Office may be advised as to how you have computed arrearages due, you should enter after the name of each member reinstated on page 3 of the Pass Report and just in front of the "Rate" column the aggregate of his old Benefit and Patriotic fund rates.

NEW PASS REPORT BOOKS, conforming to the July 1 changes were mailed by the Head Clerk to Clerks of all camps on June 27, free of charge. Exact copies of monthly Pass Reports, beginning with the No. 7 (July) should be recorded therein. SUGGES-TION: Formulate your Pass Report FIRST by using the blank pages in the Pass Report book, then when verified and found correct, carefully copy each item into the Pass Report itself. A number of Clerks have been following this plan successfully.

NEW FORMS OF COMBINATION REGISTERS will be ready for delivery upon order from and after July 15, 1919. On account of increased cost of labor and material, prices will hereafter differ slightly from quotation in Supply department catalogue, as follows:

If the order includes the writing up of the register to contain names of members, their rates, etc., the cost remains as heretofore—One cent per name and one-half cent per name additional if index is specified.

The Head Clerk is depending upon the Clerk of each Camp to make his first and subsequent reports as free from suspensions as possible. With the problem of rates satisfactorily solved, let us all respond to Head Consul Talbot's call to "pull together for the greatest growth and the largest service in our history".
