5. NO CUTS IN SERVICES, FACULTY, STAFF OR CAMPUS WORKERS
6. ENFORCEMENT OF THE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAMS; IMMEDIATELY REFILLING THE 3 VACANT CHICANO AIDE POSITIONS
